Newport News Public Schools is recruiting talented prospective Special Education, Science and Math teacher candidates for the Teacher in Residence Program. This master's program is in collaboration with Old Dominion University.

Ideal Candidate:

- Has a Bachelor's degree
- Current NNPS employee or willingness to commit to teach in Newport News Public Schools
- Has a passion for teaching diverse students in an urban setting
- Has passed Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators, VCLA, and RVE (do not need scores to apply)

The Teacher in Residence Program requires a four-year commitment to Newport News Public Schools. Residents spend the first year learning how to teach alongside a highly-trained tenured teacher while earning **a master's degree**. Residents who successfully complete the program receive priority hiring as a full-time salaried teacher in NNPS while continuing to receive professional support for their work. Residents commit to working as a full-time teacher with NNPS for the next three consecutive years

NNPS Teacher Residents receive:

- Up to \$20,000 in stipends during the residency year
- Tuition fees to be applied to a master's degree
- Virginia teaching license after completing the one-year residency
